Last fall when the publication of BAsics was announced, a prisoner wrote to PRLF about a passage from Avakian's memoir that he wanted to see in the new book:

"When I first read that a few years ago, it made my heart race. What I'm in prison for isn't important or uplifting, and it definitely didn't contribute to anything positive. It's quite shameful to be honest. I only wish if I had to be here it was for a sacrifice I made for the people." - Prisoner from California

The passage by Avakian that made his "heart race" IS included in **BAsics**, chapter 6, #18 and reads in part:

"When I look at all this, I think again of my friend who decided to dedicate his life to ending cancer—and of the even greater need to put an end to the system of capitalism-imperialism and all the suffering and oppression this system embodies and enforces throughout the world. You see that there isn't anything more important that your life could be about, and whatever you end up contributing during the course of your lifetime is the most important and the most uplifting thing that you could possibly do. And yes, there are moments of great disappointment, but also moments of great joy as part of this...."

Magnify this example many times over. Consider how this could not only impact many thousands of prisoners, but how it could then radiate back outside the prison walls to youth trapped on the bottom of society and funneled off to prison in unprecedented numbers.
